This highly anticipated change in DoD policy grants online exchange shopping privileges to an estimated eighteen million additional individuals. According to DoD officials, "The online benefit will also strengthen the exchanges" online business to better serve our current patrons. Inclusion of honorably discharged veterans would conservatively double the exchanges' online presence, thereby improving the experience for all patrons through improved vendor terms, more competitive merchandise assortments, and improved efficiencies." Scholarship Programs - Our "Voice of Democracy" audio-essay program provides high school students with the unique opportunity to express themselves in regards to a democratic and patriotic-themed recorded essay. Each year, nearly 40,000 9-12 grade students from across the country enter to win their share of \$2 million in educational scholarships and incentives awarded through the program. This years theme is "American History, Our Hope For The Future". The National 1st place winner receives a \$30,000 scholarship paid directly to the recipient's American university, college or vocational/technical school. There are also many local, District and State Scholarship Program winners.

Our "Patriot's Pen" youth essay attracts over 132,000 students in grades 6-8 to submit their essays. The national 1<sup>st</sup> place winner wins \$5,000 and an all-expense-paid trip to Washington, D.C. the 1<sup>st</sup> place winner from each state competes for national awards totaling \$54,500, with each 1<sup>st</sup> place state winner receiving a minimum of \$500 at the national level. The essay contest encourages young minds to examine America's history, along with their own experiences in modern American society, by drafting a 300-400 word essay. This years theme is "America's Gift To My Generation."
